Independence Day Facts

- The 'Pennsylvania Evening Post' was the first newspaper to print the Declaration, Saturday, July 6, 1776.
- The very first 4th of July fireworks show took place in Philadelphia in 1777. Fireworks, canons, and bells all went off to honor the 13 original states.
- The 13 original states were New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Georgia.
- An estimated 2.5 million people lived in the nation in July 1776. As of July 2021, about 331.8 million now live in the U.S.
- The Liberty Bell rings 13 times every Independence Day to honor the 13 original states.



Fourth of July Trifle



Layers of festive colors in this trifle recipe add to your Fourth of July celebration. Cut some of the strawberries into star shapes for even more patriotic flair.

Prep Time: 30 mins, Chill Time: 1 hour Total Time: 1 hour 30 mins

Ingredients

- $4\frac{1}{2}$ cup fresh strawberries, hulled and sliced.
- 1 4-serving-size package vanilla instant pudding and pie filling mix.
- 2 cup milk
- 1 8-ounce package cream cheese, softened.
- 1 5-6-ounce carton vanilla-flavored Greek yogurt
- 1 8-ounce container frozen non-dairy whipped dessert topping, thawed.
- 1 10-12 ounce purchased angel food cake, cut into 1-inch cubes.
- 1 ¹/₂ cup fresh blueberries

Directions

- 1. If desired, cut half of the strawberry slices into star shapes using a 1-inch star-shaped cutter; set aside. Prepare pudding mix according to package directions using the 2 cups milk; set aside. In a large mixing bowl beat cream cheese and yogurt with an electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Beat in pudding. Fold in whipped topping.
- 2. To assemble, spoon one-third of the cake cubes into a 2 1/2- to 3-quart trifle dish or clear glass bowl. Top with one-third of the pudding mixture. Arrange some of the star-shaped strawberries against the sides of the dish on top of the pudding mixture in dish, making a circle of star-shaped berries. Fill in the center with some of the uncut sliced strawberries. Top with a layer of one-third of the blueberries. Repeat layers. Top with remaining cake and pudding mixture. Arrange the remaining blueberries in a 3 1/2-inch rectangle in one corner of the top. Arrange remaining strawberry stars in rows, resembling stripes on a flag.
- 3. Cover and chill for up to 24 hours.
